## Sixth Form Admissions 2010

---

Now that you have your GCSE results, you will be making decisions for the coming year.

**If you have already applied to Wimbledon College Sixth Form** and been offered a conditional place please remind yourself what you need to do next (see below).

**If you did not apply for a place in the Sixth Form and you want to change your mind**, you are welcome to apply. You will need to meet the entry requirements (see below). You need to fill in an application form (available to download from the school website) and bring it with you to Sixth Form Enrolment on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> August 2010.

### Enrolment

Y12 Enrolment takes place on **Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> August** from 10.00am to 1.00pm in the Sixth Form Centre. All pupils intending to begin Y12 this September must attend. Your parents are welcome to attend also.

You need to bring to Enrolment:

- your GCSE results
- your passport (you must be a UK or EU citizen to receive free post-16 education in the UK)
- a cheque for your Common Room fee (a cheque for £75 payable to Wimbledon College)

At enrolment, your choice of options will be confirmed and we will check to see that you have met the entry requirements for the courses you have chosen. If you have not met the entry requirements, we will discuss what options are open to you.

### Entry Requirements

To enter the Sixth Form to begin A Level or Pre-U courses you need five or more GCSEs at grade C or above.

For each AS Level or Pre-U course you wish to take, you need a grade B or better at GCSE in the same subject. For those A Level subjects which are not taken at GCSE such as psychology and economics, you need a B in a relevant subject. Some subjects require a grade A for entry (including Mathematics and Economics). Pupils who took double science must have a grade A in the additional science GCSE for entry to AS Level biology, chemistry or physics.

Check the school website for a full list of subject entry requirements (Admissions > Sixth Form Admissions).

If you are planning to take a BTEC2 course, you will need a C or D grade at GCSE in the subject you wish to take.

## Canterbury Conference

All Y12 pupils from Wimbledon College and the Ursuline High School will begin the Sixth Form with a conference at Christchurch Canterbury University on **Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2010**. We depart at 8.00am sharp from the school gates and will be back around 10.45pm. You need to wear your Sixth Form suit and will be given your Sixth Form tie on the day.

The conference is a way of looking ahead to the goal of A Level studies which is university entrance. You will have an opportunity to see and hear about university application, options, finances and student life.

We will also hold our Matriculation Service at Canterbury Cathedral.

The cost of the conference is included in your Common Room fee (see below). Further details of the conference will be posted on the school website.

## Common Room Fee

The facilities provided in the Sixth Form Common Room cannot be wholly funded from the school's education budget. We therefore ask each pupil to contribute £75 at the start of Y12. This funding is used directly to improve and maintain common room and Sixth Form facilities. It also pays for the Canterbury Conference, your *Sixth Form Handbook*, ring-binders for your course notes, and your Sixth Form tie. You are required to pay the Common Room Fee on Enrolment Day. The cheque will only be cashed once you actually begin Sixth Form. If you are unable to afford all or part of the Common Room fee, please speak to the Head of Sixth Form.
