412 Régiment d'Infanterie. Of the Rouyer-Guillet Cognac family. Joined the army at 17.

Known as "L'Anglais" he served on several sectors in L'Aisne and Verdun. At Verdun he was awarded the Croix de Guerre.

Died in a counter attack between Soissons and Rheims on the 23 July 1918.

Posthumously awarded France's highest bravery decoration - Medaille Militaire. His brother Albert (OB) was the first French Irish Guards officer.
