


AN INTRODUCTION TO

WHAT IS THE LABOUR MARKET?

It's where people offer their skills, qualifications, and experience to employers in exchange for paid work (labour).




Demand can change

The skills and qualifications employers are looking for and the number of workers they are looking for can change.

Supply can change

Sometimes more people are looking for work. Sometimes less. Increased supply of workers mean employers can pay less.



WHAT IS LMI?

Labour market information (LMI) is data that reflects what is going on in the labour market. It can help us make informed decisions by providing information about what is going on in the world of work.



EVERYONE HAS A STORY

Quantitative Data

Facts and figures about jobs and employment e.g. how many people are looking for work; how many jobs; salary; hours; trends

Qualitative Data

Insights into what the world of work and specific jobs or industries or types of work are like.

Labour market intelligence

Where labour market information is applied to your situation and needs.



LMI CAN HELP US TO UNDERSTAND THE WORLD OF WORK:

- The kind and number of jobs available (by area/sector)
- The skills and jobs that are (or will be) in demand
- Entry routes, pathways, and progression routes
- The skills and qualifications you might need
- · Salaries, earning potential, and prospect of promotion
- Working patterns, hours, employer cultures, equality of opportunity, and more



Factors impacting the labour market

Technology Adoption / Automation

Impacting many jobs many of which need digital skills.

Globalisation

An increasingly global labour market, impact on local labour markets.

Attitudes / Behaviours

Not easy to predict and can impact popularity of goods/services

Demographics

Age of populations impacts many sectors including social care from a worker and consumer perspective.

Climate Change & Environmental Agenda

Increased awareness and focus on the environment.

Macroeconomic Factors

Rate of economic growth can impact consumers (cost of living).
