

Head Master's End of Term Letter to Parents

Dear Parents/Guardians

I write concerning a number of items that I hope you will find both useful and of interest to you.

Report Card and Lower Line set changes

Parents of boys in Years 7-10 should receive their son's grade card with this letter, while parents of Syntax boys should receive their son's report with this letter. As you know the grades are colour coded so that you can see an overall impression of your son's achievement and progress in each subject. By this point in the year you should be seeing a shift from red to green as you look across the report. If you, or your son, feel his target grades are too low or too high please speak to your son's Head of Line. May I remind you that if you wish to receive an up to date grade card at any point during the term please contact your son's Head of Line.

We are in the process of making set changes in Lower Line. Boys affected will be informed of the changes on their return to school after the Easter holiday.

Oklahoma!

This year's musical, Oklahoma, was a great success with some outstanding performances from the pupils from the College and the Ursuline High School. It was pleasing to see new faces among the cast and more boys performing in the orchestra. As always the stage crew and technical teams fulfilled invaluable roles. Together with all of our staff, who worked so hard preparing the actors both in the weeks leading up to the performances and on the nights themselves, they created a wonderful show. Music school

Supporting GCSE, AS and A level students

I would encourage parents to ensure that your son has the necessary resources available to him to support his revision and exam preparation over the Easter holidays. It is important that the boys use the time effectively over the Easter holidays revising for their exams. Please encourage them to have an established pattern of work but also to build in time for exercise, as this is also important.

There are a number of revision classes running over the holidays and these are advertised on our website.

I would also like to point out to parents of boys in Syntax that the examination timetable is available on the College website. Please be aware that the exams get underway on the 8th of May and that the vast majority of examinations will have taken place by half term. This really does put even more importance on the boys using the Easter holidays effectively in preparation for their exams.

Positive Behaviour Policy

After Easter we will be focusing as a school on our positive behaviour policy. The policy is in place to ensure that the focus of lessons and homework is on learning and that the boys make the progress that they are capable of. As part of this, and following consultation with staff and reviewing current behaviour patterns, I have taken the decision to restore the sanction of a Saturday detention for boys who are sent out of a lesson for poor behaviour. It is important that low level misbehaviour does not prevent any boy from achieving their potential. Our policy does focus on recognising and praising the positive and I know that our boys respond to this. Ofsted recognised that "students' behaviour is of a very high standard and they feel happy and safe at school". We are working to ensure that we build on this as part of our drive to becoming outstanding.

Cancer Research UK

We have been raising money throughout Lent for Cancer Research UK and at the time of writing we have collected over £2000. I am very grateful for the effort that the boys have made and for your support. I am also conscious that the fundraising activities are ongoing and I hope to see a significant increase in our collection total. As with the collection for the Philippines Mr Potter has created a Just Giving page where you can donate directly and, if you are a tax payer, sign up for Gift Aid.

Rugby

Our sevens teams have had a successful season holding their own against the top rugby schools in the country. Our most successful team this year was our Under 13 squad who won the Surrey Sevens and lost in the quarter finals of the Junior National Schools competition.

We have also welcomed two Canadian touring parties this term and our own Junior tour has departed this week for America. We wish them well in their fixtures against Jesuit schools and in the Jesuit Rugby Classic taking place in Washington.

Swimming

The Swimming squad has continued to build on recent Gala weeks and ended the term with a victory over London Nautical School. Earlier in the term we had participated in the Trinity Trust Gala, where our Rudiments and Lower Grammar squads came third in their respective tournaments. Importantly in terms of the future strength of the swimming squad there have been in excess of 30 personal best times set this term.
