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#### Headteacher's End of Year Letter to Parents

**Dear Parents** 

A busy and eventful last week has brought what has been a demanding year to an end in a very positive way. The two days of house activities and sports day were engaged in extremely positively by the pupils and they resulted in Loyola House winning the overall House Competition for 2021/22. We finished the year with the traditional Mass of St Ignatius where we remembered, celebrated and thanked God for everything that has taken place over the course of the academic year.

Covid continued to impact on the health and attendance of both pupils and staff all year and I am grateful for the way in which everyone has persevered to ensure that our pupils have been able to once again experience all elements of school life. It has been wonderful to see extracurricular activities return to something close to the breadth of offer pre Covid and to see pupils participating in school trips, the most recent being the highly successful Pilgrimage and Choir Tour to Rome.

In addition, we have also seen the embedding of our timetabled PSHE programme and a much enhanced Careers offer for all pupils as well as additional support for our more able pupils. It is fantastic that five of our Year 13 pupils have offers of places at Oxbridge along with a confirmed place for one of our 2021 leavers. This is the highest number for over 20 years. We wish them and all Rhetoric and Syntax pupils well with their exam results in August.

As a school community we suffered the death of two staff, Mr Jack Berry and Mrs. Jen Lawrence in the Autumn term. The response both from within the school community and from the wider community was a tremendous support and we continue to remember them both, and their families, in our prayers.

As this term has come to an end we have seen the scaffolding rise above the roof of the school in preparation for the replacement of part of the roof over the summer holidays. It is expected that the work will continue into next term however this will not impact on teaching spaces. As the summer holidays begin the school is busy with numerous contractors working in different areas of the site to renovate and improve our facilities in preparation for September.

### Staff leaving

We say farewell to a number of staff leaving us at the end of the year. Amongst them are two members of staff who have both been members of the school community for the last twenty years. Mrs. O'Grady has supported both pupils and staff in her role as Higher Line Pastoral Support Assistant since 2002 and before that she worked at St Catherine's Middle School from 1995 to 2002. Mrs. Weeks, in her role as a Learning Support Assistant has worked closely with many pupils over the twenty years. Both will be sorely missed and we wish them a very happy retirement.

Mr Hoban is retiring from teaching and his role as Head of Line [having seen the current Syntax year group through to their GCSE examinations], which he has held for the last eight years. Before that he had taught at Raynes Park High School for 27 years. While wishing him a happy retirement we are not saying farewell. He will be back with us in September in a non-teaching role.

Other staff leaving the College this year are Miss Ayari [LSA], Mr Brewster [LSA], Mr Keane [PE & Science teacher], Mr Mundy [English teacher and TSA], Ms Spyropoulos [LSA] and Mrs. Van Moer [LSA]

On behalf of the College community I would like to take this opportunity to thank them all for everything that they have contributed to the College and wish them every success in the future.

## **Key dates:**

GCSE and Syntax vocational results are available from school on **Thursday 25 August** from 8.30am until 9.30am in the main hall.

Once pupils have received their results on Thursday 25 August they will be able to complete their online enrolment form on Applicaa. They will be able to do this in school and this should be completed by 11.00am [computer rooms will be available].

If pupils wish to consider an alternative course or have not met their course requirements they will be asked to speak with a member of the enrolling team. This will take place as follows on the 25 August:

9.00am Pupils with surnames A – L 11.00am Pupils with surnames M – Z

I would like to remind you that pupils will require their passports and means to pay the appropriate fees.

#### Uniform
