Report Card and Lower Line set changes

This Friday parents of boys in Years 7-10 should receive their son's grade card, while parents of Syntax and Poetry boys should be receiving their son's report. The Poetry reports are being posted to parents. You will see your son's target grade on their grade card or report and by this point in the year you should be seeing him achieving grades close to his targets. If you, or your son, feel his target grades are too low or too high please speak to your son's Head of Line. May I remind you that if you wish to receive an up to date grade card at any point during the term please contact your son's Head of Line.

We are in the process of making set changes in Lower Line. Boys affected will be informed of the changes on their return to school after the Easter holiday.

Wimbledon College Arts Festival 2015

Supporting GCSE, AS and A level students

Please encourage them to have an established pattern of work but also to build in time for exercise, as this is also important.

I would also like to point out to parents of boys in Syntax and the Sixth Form that the examination timetable is available on the College website. Please be aware that the exams get underway at the beginning of May and that the vast majority of GCSE and AS examinations will have taken place by half term. This really does put even more importance on the boys using the Easter holidays effectively in preparation for their exams.

For the Greater Glory of God

My assemblies this week have focused on the Passion of Jesus, which will be remembered during the liturgies of Holy Week, and our response to Christ's Passion. I have reminded the boys of one of the central teachings of St Ignatius and that is that no matter how small or inconsequential we might think our actions are we should always do everything for the greater glory of God [Ad Majoriam Dei Gloriam]. As you are well aware the boys put the initials AMDG at the beginning of every piece of work, but it does not stop there. As a Jesuit school we strive to develop in the boys this principle that everything that they do can and should be for the greater glory of God. Over the coming term we will be reflecting on this with the boys and looking again at how all aspects of school life, their involvement in it and their concern for others should be in response to God's love for us.
