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Headteacher's Autumn Half-Term Letter to Parents

Dear Parents

The year is now well underway and it is wonderful to see how many pupils are engaged in the College's many extra-curricular activities both during and outside of the school day. As part of monitoring of pupils' engagement with extra-curricular activities we have sent out a short survey to all pupils in Years 7-11, via their Tutor Group Google Classrooms. Would you please ensure that you child completes this over the half term.

It has also been good to see so many parents in school again for our parent information evenings at the beginning of term and also at our two successful Open Evenings for pupils looking to join the College either in Year 7 or Year 12 next September. As you may be aware work continues on the retiling of a significant section of the College roof. The work is going well and is due to be completed, with all scaffolding removed, by the end of November. I must acknowledge how well pupils, and staff, have coped with the challenges that the building work has provided this term.

I wrote last year about our plans to install a 3G rugby standard all-weather pitch on the College site for this term. Due to delays in receiving final clearance from Thames Water and Merton Council we have pushed back the installation until next summer.

Grade cards for pupils in Years 7-11 will be sent out electronically this week for the last half term. You will have noticed that they have been restyled and now include data from previous years within each Key Stage. If you have not received your child's grade card would you please email their Head of Line to let them know.

A reminder that online applications for pupils starting in Year 7 in September 2023 have to be submitted by 31 October 2022 and Supplementary Information Forms have to be sent to the College by this date. This year we have introduced an online process, which is available via the admissions page on the College website.

The Syntax students were able to see the wide variety of courses that are offered at Wimbledon College at the KS5 Curriculum Evening.
