

Headteacher's End of Term Letter to Parents

Friday 16 December 2022

Dear Parents

As we come to the end of term facing the cold snap and transport strikes I would like to thank you for your continued support of the College. The term has been a busy one and a very successful one. The pupils have, as always, engaged fully in their learning and all of the additional opportunities available to them. As you are aware, last week saw us welcome the Diocesan Inspectors who carried out our Denominational [Section 48] Inspection. The report from the inspection will be released towards the end of January. The inspectors were grateful for the responses received from parents. It is fair to say that from the inspection they were able to obtain a clear understanding of the College's vision and values and how they are lived out.

I am conscious that we have had many pupils and staff suffering from a variety of throat and chest infections over the last couple of weeks. This is reflected across the Borough and the Local Authority have asked me to share the following link with you [Keeping you and your children safe and well]. I hope that you are able to keep warm and remain in good health over the Christmas period.

Departments will be also using this data to make changes to setting, pupils affected by these changes will receive a new timetable in January.

PSHE

Over the term we have welcomed a variety of external speakers to the College to enhance our PSHE programme. We would like to thank all of them who have given of their time to support the pupils learning. These included CAFOD, Red Cross and the theatre company 'Loudmouth', who provided a production and workshops on the issue of sexual harassment in society to Lower Grammar students.

Careers

Our careers programme continues to be very busy with many speakers and events across all age groups. If you did not have the opportunity to read the Careers bulletin that was sent out to parents last week, I urge you to look at it as it gives a flavour of the careers advice and guidance that pupils are receiving.

School Council

Following the School Council caucus which took place during an extended tutor group time a representative from each tutor group met on Friday 9th December for the first Student Council meeting for the year. The focus of the meeting was environmental issues, working in their houses pupils produced a presentation which considered how looking after the environment fits in with the qualities of the Jesuit Pupil Profile and put forward recommendations for what we can do as a school to have a positive impact on the environment. These recommendations have been shared with the College's leadership team.

Their commitment and engagement have been tremendous and a credit to all staff and pupils who have helped represent Wimbledon College and allow the students to have this opportunity. A huge thank you to Mr Simon and the Games staff on Figures games who have worked with all of this year group.

The cancellation of our final block against Emanuel school was a disappointment but unfortunately, the only and correct decision for ensuring player welfare. It did however, take away the opportunity for our teams to try and end the season on a high. We must now continue to look forward and use the knowledge and skills developed this year and take them into our 7s season which starts after February half term.

On reflection it gives me great pride to see how many teams and fixtures we regularly put out on a Saturday. This is only possible due to the dedication, commitment and effort of all involved, especially the staff who without them, this extra-curricular provision would not be possible. A huge thank you to them, I sincerely hope your child has enjoyed the experience of playing and challenging themselves against some of the best schools in the south east of England. It is a tough fixture card but we hope that the overall experience is beneficial for your child in all areas of physical, mental and social health.

This season we have played 170 fixtures over 12 weeks. Fielding over 21 teams and improving our win percentage on the previous season. We are still below our overall percentage pre-covid but we will continue to build, get stronger and develop as we move forward.

As previously mentioned, our 7s season starts in late February. Training for this will commence on the w/b 9th January. Please see the details for training below.

Uniform suppliers - ClothesLine

I have to inform you that one of our long-standing uniform suppliers, ClothesLine [youruniform.co.uk] is closing. The owners, who have worked closely with the school for many years have taken the decision to retire and I would like to publicly thank them for

everything that they have done for the school and wish Canute and Delia D'Aguair a very happy and well-deserved retirement.

We are pleased to announce that Village Sports, who are based in Raynes Park, will now be working with us and will be one of our uniform suppliers, taking over from ClothesLine. It is hoped that there will be a smooth transition at the start of next term. School Uniform Direct continue to supply Wimbledon College uniform.

Support with the purchasing of College uniform

I am aware that families may be finding it difficult to purchase items of school uniform at the current time due to financial reasons. We do have provision in place to support our families.
