Head Master's End of Term Letter to Parents

Dear Parents

I must apologise for the delay in sending out my letter to you all and I hope that you had a peaceful and enjoyable Easter. Many of our pupils are involved in school trips over the holidays. The ski trip to Austria has returned and by all accounts was a very enjoyable and successful trip. At the end of the holiday a number of our Poetry pupils are participating in a Leadership Conference being hosted by Mount St Mary's College, as part of their 175th Anniversary celebrations.

Last term was a busy and successful one, during which we welcomed our new Provincial, Fr Damian Howard SJ for his first annual visitation. He spent a day at the College and met with various pupils, members of staff and governors. In the afternoon he celebrated Mass with Lower Line in the Sacred Heart Church. It was his first visit to the College and it gave him the opportunity to understand how well the College is progressing.

During Lent the boys, as I am sure you are aware, have been raising money for CAFOD. Each tutor group set its own target in the knowledge that the Government is match funding all money raised for CAFOD during their Lenten appeal. I would be grateful if you would ensure that your son has handed in all of the money that he has raised by the end of the first week back after the holidays. Thank you for your support over the Lenten period.

The boys also had the opportunity to participate in a reconciliation service and to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The term ended with our traditional Tenebrae service where, led by our Chaplain, Mr Potter, we reflected on the suffering of Christ leading up to his crucifixion.

It is a demanding and stressful time for your sons, as I am sure that you are aware, and I encourage them to take advantage of all the support that they will be given by their teachers.

Les Miserables

The College's production of Les Miserables, took place over three nights from the 21st to the 22rd of March, and was both a sell out and an outstanding success. The very high standard of performances from all involved was a real credit to the pupils themselves and to the staff who had worked with them throughout rehearsals. Rugby Sevens

Sadly Sevens fixtures were badly affected by the poor weather of the last few weeks resulting in over 75% of all of the proposed tournaments being cancelled, including our own John Pieroni 7s.

Where the tournaments did take place our teams performed well and the boys demonstrated the high level of quality and commitment that we are accustomed to seeing from College teams. Of the 87 games played we won 48 and drew 6. The most notable achievements were the Under 15 Team winning the John Fisher Founders Day 7s and the Under 13 team who won 11 out of 13 games.

I must thank all of the boys and staff for their commitment to the Sevens and also to rugby throughout the year. As I have already mentioned we currently have our Canada tour taking place.

Football

Unfortunately the poor weather has also affected our football season with many games cancelled as a consequence. Despite this the boys have remained positive and there have been excellent performances across all years. Our most successful teams have been the Year 7 team and the Year 8 team who have both reached the quarter finals of the Surrey Cup and the First XI who have gone one stage further reaching the semi-final of the Surrey Cup and the London Catholic Schools Cup. This fixture is due to be played in the first week back after Easter.

I would also like to pass on Mr Barnes thanks to all parents for their support for all of the teams this season and particularly those parents who have provided refreshments at all home fixtures.

Basketball

It has been pleasing to see that our teams have made real progress this term, thanks to the clever guidance of our new coach, Roz Mason. The boys have shown fantastic enthusiasm and commitment over the year. Special mention must go to the Under 12 Basketball team who have won 8 out of their 10 matches, and who finished 3rd in Surrey after a close loss to the eventual winners in the Semi-Finals.
