5 Top Tips for Parents and Carers who are supporting their child to explore apprenticeships and other options.

- 1) Be open-minded and prepared to explore a range of options with your child You may be really surprised at what you find out. Try to put to one side your preconceptions of what you think is best, and be open to look at everything.
- 2) Think twice Technical or Academic? There is no one better route, but there are many quality options available within both. It's important to explore all of the options that are available.
- 3) Think about your child's preferred learning style It doesn't matter what their ability level is, but thinking about their learning style may help you to think about the appropriate options to explore further. Use the support available to you
- 4) Don't be afraid to ask your child's school for support. They are there to help your child to prepare for their next level of transition.
- 5) Don't expect your child to know what they want to do We know from research that many young people are not yet ready to select a career, and will want to try out many different career options in their lifetime.

Pupils across all year groups had the opportunity to sign up and listen to the **Metropolitan Police** talk about their <u>Gateway Apprenticeship program</u> (Level 4 & Level 6 apprenticeships).
