

Headteacher's Letter to Parents

Dear Parents

As a very busy term comes to an end I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a very peaceful Easter. Our term ended with our Tenebrae services where we reflected on the forthcoming events of Holy Week and the sacrifice and death of Christ and we will start the Summer term with celebrations of Easter and the Resurrection of Jesus. Both services enable us all to consider the importance of these events in our own lives.

As you are aware we had our Ofsted Inspection just before the end of term and I would like to thank all parents who supported the College by completing the Ofsted Questionnaire on Parent View. Mr Michael Mahoney RIP

Sadly, I have to inform you of the death of a former Deputy Headmaster and Governor, Mr Michael Mahoney.

Mr Mahoney was a valued and highly respected member of staff who served the College as a member of staff for 37 years. During his time at Deputy he had oversight of the St Catherine's site, when the College expanded to take pupils from Year 7. He gave a tremendous amount of his time and energy to the College and always found time to support both pupils and staff. A former colleague has recounted that he used to say of the pupils, 'catch them being good... it is important to remember to praise them'. In many ways this captures his passion and concern for the wellbeing of the pupils under his care.



When he retired from teaching, Michael took up the role of Governor, which he undertook with the same energy and enthusiasm and it was in this capacity that I got to know him and benefitted from his knowledge and love of the College.

He will be greatly missed and I ask that you remember Mr Mahoney, his wife and family in your prayers.

Eternal rest grant unto him O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen.

Refectory Price increases

Due to significant increases in both food and staffing costs I have to inform you that we have had to take the decision to increase the prices on all items available in the Refectory with immediate effect. We do have the capacity for parents to set a daily limit on your child's spending in the Refectory. Pupils in Year 8 enjoyed a very successful House Activity Day where they worked together and competed in a range of activities in order to gain as many points as possible for their Houses. Activities ranged from code breaking, bridge building and House Football. Well done to all who took part and achieved vital points for their Houses.

Enrichment opportunities

Over the course of the term a variety of enrichment activities have been taking place in addition to all of our regular clubs and activities. Our Lower Line *Poetry by Heart* poetry performance winners were Nathan Babb, Philip Sawicki and Paul Zogbessou. Congratulations to them and we wish them well as their entries have been uploaded to the National Finals.

Paul was also successful in our Pi recital competition [which took place on 14 March - I will leave you to work out why], where pupils were challenged to recite the decimal version of Pi to as many decimal places as possible. Paul achieved a new school record recalling Pi to 107 decimal places.



Our two Jack Petchey Speak Out winners, Evan Rushforth and Charlie Wilson, both in Year 10, went on to compete in the Merton regional finals where they performed very well.

The Year 9 'Senior Aspirations' group enjoyed a specially-adapted performance of *The Tempest* at The Globe while our Year 10 group had a great time at the riotous historical musical, *Six*. We have also had two successful A Level trips to *Hamlet* and *Titus Andronicus*.

The Drama Department were once again extremely pleased to be part of the King's College Community Production, where the Rime of the Ancient Mariner involved a number of local schools performing different scenes. Our pupils worked closely with students from King's College to develop their piece. This resulted in an excellent imaginative, witty and clever performance. It was clear from the performance that the pupils had enjoyed the experience and that they have benefitted from working with pupils from other schools. A special thank you to Miss Moore and all of the staff who supported the pupils.

Cricket

The cricket season is set to begin after Easter with training sessions and matches. Sessions will run from 3.15 – 4.45. Pupils should wear House kit or cricket whites with trainers (not spikes).

All boys are welcome whether first timers or experienced cricketers. All equipment is provided but if boys have their own, they are welcome to bring it for the training sessions.

A blend of some of the biggest, most prestigious & famous schools in the SE of England. I'd like to take this opportunity to once again thank Mr Bracken and all the College staff who helped me with the running and organisation of this event. It was another major success and the positive feedback from those in attendance was a true reflection of what we can offer the rugby community and a reason so many schools want to be part of this event.

Further to my thanks, without the parents from the U15 team we really couldn't have catered for all in such a way that makes others envious of what we have. A huge thank you to Mrs Austin for coordinating the parental help and to all those that took up the call to assist and volunteered your time.
