Dear Parents

This year has been a busy one and a successful one in many ways. As you are aware we received positive outcomes from our two external inspections. In March our Ofsted Inspection identified us as continuing to be a good school, with many strengths and our Diocesan Inspection, last December, found us to be an outstanding Catholic school. Importantly we continue to provide a breadth of opportunities for our pupils within the academic curriculum and our extensive extra-curricular offer.

We marked the end of our academic year with two days of House activities and with our traditional Masses of St Ignatius. The masses were celebrated by Fr Michael Barnes SJ and Fr Michael Holman SJ, both of whom are former pupils of Wimbledon College. We were also very fortunate to have a number of Jesuits in Formation, including Dr Taylor SJ, with us during the last week of term. They spent time visiting classes, leading a retreat for a group of pupils and provided a powerful reflection on the life of St Ignatius, combined with their own journeys as Jesuits, at our final masses. We wish them all well in their continued studies and in particular Peter O'Sullivan SJ who is being ordained a priest this Saturday.



The term ended with a lot of preparatory work being undertaken by our contractors. Scaffolding is in the process of being erected both inside and over the swimming pool in preparation for the new roof and heavy construction vehicles were also busy preparing the way for our 3G pitch to be installed on the College field. my office last week]. Both projects will continue into the Autumn term and will inevitably impact the PE and Games department during this time. All other areas of the College will continue as normal.

Sixth Form Enrolment

Syntax pupils have already received information about enrolment and I am aware Mrs Town has sent a letter to parents explaining this year's enrolment process.



Once pupils have received their results on Thursday 24 August they will be able to complete their online enrolment form on Applicaa. They will be able to do this in school, from 8.45am, [computer rooms will be available].

Further details of the induction process have been sent out to parents and pupils. I would like to remind you that pupils will require their passports and means to pay the appropriate fees.

Uniform

As always, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for ensuring that your children come to school with the correct uniform and with an appropriate hair style.

If you are finding it difficult, for financial reasons, to purchase any item of school uniform for your child then please contact your child's PSA and we will do what we can to support you.

Changes to school coats

I want to bring to your attention the new school uniform rules that come into effect from 1 September 2023 regarding pupils' overcoats. They are as follows:

Pupils in Years 7-11 may wear a plain black overcoat without a logo. All coats must have sleeves. Coats may have a hood. Hoods are not to be worn when on the school site.

This means that we are allowing pupils in Years 7-11 to wear plain black coats with hoods from September. Pupils in Lower Line no longer have to wear the College reversible jacket. They can continue to wear the College jacket if they wish to do so.

Shoes

I am aware that many of you will be buying new shoes for your sons over the summer and I direct you to the uniform and suitable shoe pages on our website [the Transition to the College page of the Parents section] for the relevant information about what shoes are acceptable. I must emphasise that we insist on *black, leather, plain, formal and polished shoes*. I must also point out that our list of unacceptable brands [to be found in our 'a Guide for New Parents' on the Transition to the College page of the College website] is not exhaustive. They are simply given as examples.

I must emphasise that trainers or shoes that have the appearance of trainers are not acceptable and parents will be expected change unacceptable shoes. I really do urge you to ensure that you buy the correct style of shoe to avoid any unnecessary expense, if you have to buy a second pair of shoes.
