

#### Headteacher's Letter to Parents

Thursday 28 March 2024

**Dear Parents** 

It has been great to see so many extra-curricular opportunities taking place for pupils over the last few weeks and indeed that will take place over Easter.

We welcomed back our Year 9 pupils from their French Exchange on Wednesday and on the same day our Sixth Form Business and Economics trip departed for New York. Tomorrow our Rudiments skiers depart for Austria and during the holidays our rugby players depart for their tour to Canada. We also had the pleasure of welcoming one of the Canadian schools as part of their tour over last weekend. The boys were hosted by our pupils and played against the College teams in two hard fought games on Saturday.

This brought the end to the rugby season following a range of sevens tournaments involving pupils from all year groups. The Football season has also come to a close. Thank you to all parents who have supported the College through hosting visiting players, helping out at home fixtures and by ensuring that your children get to all of their fixtures.

Term ended today with our Tenebrae services where we reflected on the forthcoming events of the Triduum and the sacrifice and death of Christ. Despite the atrocious weather as boys walked down to the Sacred Heart Church, the pupils' behaviour and participation in the service were excellent.

I would also like to ask you to remember in your prayers our former pupil, Luca Buttaci, and his family. As you are aware Luca, who left the College in 2021, died at the beginning of March following a long illness due to cancer. # Use of mobile phones and banning smart watches in school

As I am sure you are aware the Government has asked that there is greater restriction of pupils' use of mobile phones in schools.

Our policy regarding mobile phones in school is clear and laid out in our Behaviour Policy. Pupils are allowed to bring mobile phones to school, however they must be switched off when the pupils are on Edge Hill and while at school, unless they are given permission by a teacher to use their phones in support of a lesson. Phones must then be switched off again once the task has been completed.

If we find that a pupil has their phone switched on [and this includes on silent or 'air plane' mode] then their phone will be confiscated for five days.

The exception to this is Sixth Form students who are allowed to use their phones in the Sixth From area. They are not allowed to use them around the school.

Unfortunately, we have had a number of incidents where pupils have been using their smart watches, which are connected to their phones, in lessons for accessing messages, etc and thus have been a distraction to learning. As a consequence, we have taken the decision to ban the wearing and use of smart watches at school. Pupils can of course use normal watches that have no capacity to connect to mobile phones, laptops, etc or to access the internet.

I ask that you support the school in this measure, so that we can ensure learning is not disrupted in this way, by informing your children that smart watches are not allowed in school. The ban on smart watches is effective from the start of next term [15 April 2024]. Smart watches will be confiscated for five days, if they are brought into school.

### Nut free school

I must remind all parents that we are a nut free school. The reason for this is that we have a number of pupils who have severe allergic reactions to nuts.

We have become aware that a very small number of pupils have recently been bringing nuts into school to eat as a snack. This is not acceptable as it places those pupils with allergies at risk.

Would you therefore ensure that you do not send your children to school with nuts [either separately or as an ingredient in other food products] as part of their packed lunch. I would also ask that you discuss nut allergies with your children so that they know not to buy nuts on the way to school and then bring them into school.

## **School Uniform Code**

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all parents of our expectations regarding our School Uniform Code. This includes the uniform itself as well as wearing proper school shoes and adhering to expectations regarding hair styles. Main school pupils should also be clean shaven.



All pupils are expected to be in correct uniform. I ask that all parents support the College in this matter and that over the Easter holidays you ensure that your child has the correct uniform and that their appearance is in line with the College's Appearance Rules.
