At Wimbledon College, we believe every student should have the chance to explore the world of work, understand their options, and plan for a successful future. Our Careers Programme runs from Year 7 to Year 13 and gives students the information, skills, and experiences they need to move confidently into further education, apprenticeships, university, or work.

### Students will experience:

- Careers lessons in PSHE and across subjects
- One-to-one guidance with a qualified Careers Adviser
- Unifrog, a careers and destinations platform for exploring jobs, courses, and apprenticeships
- Talks from employers, universities, and former students
- Visits to colleges, universities, and workplaces
- Mock interviews and CV writing support
- Work experience in Year 10 and Year 12
- Mentoring programmes to support career choices (e.g. Mosaic, Oxbridge, Medicine)
- Events such as Future Options Fair, National Careers Week and Apprenticeship Week

### As a student at Wimbledon College, you are entitled to:

- Clear, unbiased information about your career, apprenticeship, and education options
- Opportunities to learn about different jobs and the skills they require
- Support to help you understand your strengths and career interests
- Guidance to help you plan your next steps - after GCSEs, sixth form, and beyond
- Access to meaningful encounters with employers and training providers
- Help with job applications, CVs, and interview skills
- A high-quality work experience placement to develop real-world skills
- A personalised careers meeting before you leave school
