Oversubscription Criteria

- 1. Catholic boys who are looked after children or looked after children in the care of Catholic families or who were previously looked after children
- 2. Catholic boys who have special circumstances
- 3. Catholic boys who attend Mass every Sunday and Holyday
- 4. Catholic boys who attend Mass less frequently than every Sunday and Holyday
- 5. Catholic boys who do not attend Mass
- 6. Boys enrolled in the catechumenate
- 7. Other boys who are looked after or previously looked after.
- 8. Boys who are members of the Eastern Orthodox Churches.
- 9. Boys of families who are members of other Christian denominations that are part of Churches Together in England
- 10. Boys who are members of other faiths
- 11. Other boys

- 31 on the waiting list eventually got in for September
- All Category applications who had brothers at the College were offered places.
- Category 3 Furthest on distance criterion [1/3/18] = 5.015 km [2017 6.777km]
- Category 3 Furthest on distance criterion [7/9/18] = 6.980 km



Admissions 2019

In September 2019, Wimbledon College will admit 199 boys to Figures (Year 7) without regard for aptitude or ability. The places will offered according to the criteria set out in the 2019 Admissions Policy. For information regarding Sixth Form, please visit the Sixth Form Admissions page.

Application Deadline & Offers of Places

The deadline for Y7 Applications for admission in September 2019 is Wednesday 31st October 2018. You must submit both the Common Application Form (CAF) to your Local Authority and the Wimbledon College Supplementary Form (SIF) to Wimbledon College by this date.

Your Local Authority will write to you on 1st March 2019, indicating the school highest on your list which is able to offer you a place. We will also write to you confirming whether or not we were able to offer a place. You must accept or reject the offer by a specified date (tbc). After that time, any unaccepted offers will be withdrawn.

Transition to the College

The College seeks to ensure that the transition from primary to secondary school is as supportive as possible.

Primary School Visits

In the Summer Term the Head of Figures (Y7) will visit primary schools. During these visits, pupils will get a chance to discuss life at College and ask any questions they may have. It also gives the opportunity to meet Year 6 teachers and exchange as much information as possible to aid a successful, happy transition.

Year 6 Test Day

The College holds a test day for all pupils starting in September held on a Saturday morning in June, this year's date is:

Pupils sit a series of short Cognitive Abilities Tests (CATs) which give us useful information about the pupils and are also used to set them for the start of Year 7. Parents get a copy of the results and more detailed information about how these are used is given at the Year 6 Transition Meetings.
